

Drosophilidae (Diptera) of Sabah, Borneo, of Dr. G. Imadaté's collection in 1968

About eighteen-hundred specimens of the family Drosophilidae were collected by Dr. Gentaro Imadaté of the Tokyo Medical and Dental University during his survey as the leader in an expedition, Japanese Students Training Party to Pensiangan, Sabah, conducted by the Committee for Southeast Asian Studies of the Osaka City University, in 1968.

The collection was found to involve eighteen named and two unnamed species, of which nine named were new to Sabah. The drosophilid species of Sabah have so far been recorded by Mather (1968a,b), Wilson et al. (1969), Bock and Wheeler (1972), Takada et al. (1973), and Okada (1964, 1974), approximating thirty-five in number. Consequently, total number in this state attains forty-five, and that in whole Borneo more than sixty.
